Open access (OA) is the free and unrestricted online access to scientific and scholarly information "permitting any users to read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of these articles, crawl them for indexing, pass them as data to software, or use them for any other lawful purpose, without financial, legal, or technical barriers other than those inseparable from gaining access to the internet itself."

While OA is a newer form of scholarly publishing, many OA journals comply with well-established peer-review processes and maintain high publishing standards. There are a number of variants of open access publishing and different publishers may use one or more of these variants, the most common being Gold OA and Green OA.

Since 2010, the University of Bremen has supported Open Access publishing and has offered funding for "Article Processing Charges" or "Publication Fees" in OA publications to its members. At this info event, colleagues from the university library will introduce the different standards in OA publishing and how these are supported by the university.
