Objectives

Working and researching across cultures remotely or in person, although it has become the new normal for many young scientists and business professionals, has its pitfalls and challenges. Diverse teams can work together more efficiently and trustfully if they learn to handle cultural diversity in a productive way. This requires that they understand both their commonalities and their differences: their ways to communicate with one another, to take their decisions or to schedule their projects.

This course is not about putting people into boxes along the cultures they come from or live in. It is about understanding the many ways in which cultures (of countries, professions, organisations, regions, generations, ...) can shape our ways to feel and think, evaluate and act, while we continue to be individuals with our unique preferences. Compare your experiences to those of your fellow participants and cultural research results, and discuss best practice and solutions for tricky situations.

Topics which will be covered include

- Cultures as orientation systems
- Communication strategies across cultures
- Egalitarian vs hierarchical leadership
- Relationship vs task oriented cultures
- Time scheduling strategies in different societies
- Transcultural Learning: identifying and creating commonalities
- Case studies.
