

MARUM / GLOMAR Transferable Skills Course

Communicate your Science

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2 – 3 June 2015, MARUM Bremen

Objectives

Scientists are frequently required to transfer their knowledge to colleagues from other disciplines or non-scientists like journalists. The success of scientists' efforts to teach, acquire research funds, work in interdisciplinary environments as well as to reach out to the public and to raise awareness for important issues heavily depends on their skills to present their expert knowledge in an *interesting and accessible way*.

This two-day course offers practical exercises (writing and presenting) which can help to improve your science communication abilities. It also offers an excursion to Hamburg, where we will visit the editorial offices of the German weekly newspaper *DIE ZEIT* and the German *National Geographic* magazine. Science and chief-editors will provide insights of how media outlets work and how your science could make it into news headlines.
